- The customer must have a letter from his/her physician on letterhead with an issue-date of no more
 than one year prior to flight departure date. The letter from the doctor is a requirement of Federal
 Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations. The letter must include the following information:
- 1. Whether the user is able to operate the device, recognize and respond appropriately to its alarms; and if not, that the user is traveling with a companion who is able to perform these functions.
- 2. The phases of the flight (taxi, takeoff, cruise, landing) during which use of the device is medically necessary.
- 3. The maximum flow rate corresponding to the pressure in the cabin under normal operating conditions. (Cabins are pressurized to an altitude of 8,000 feet.)

Please note: Generic forms printed from the FAA website, or elsewhere, will NOT be accepted as valid documentation for bringing a POC. Customers may wish to contact the manufacturer of their POC if their physician is not familiar with the POC and is having problems providing the FAA-required letter.

 The customer must check-in with a JetBlue Airways crewmember at the airport on the day of departure for a boarding pass no later than one hour from departure and must present the POC and paperwork for inspection by a JetBlue crewmember.
